- Any yarn is permissible except where otherwise specified
- Feature stich for 2025: Butterfly Lace stitch (knitting stitch)
- Entries can be collected from 6pm onwards on day of show, Saturday, March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Entries and/or prize money not collected on this day will be forfeited.
